Summary of Experience

Katherine's career spans four continents and some of the practice's most complex and high-profile commissions. As a Senior Associate, she combines design leadership with technical rigour, delivering ambitious projects from concept to completion at exceptional scale.

Currently based in Taipei, Katherine is leading the delivery of key visual interiors for Taoyuan International Airport Terminal 3 - a landmark infrastructure project shaping the future of travel in Asia. She is directing both the design and implementation of the Cloud, a 95,000-pixel ceiling installation spanning the full length of the terminal, while coordinating multidisciplinary teams responsible for the final integration of major building elements. She also played a pivotal role in the detailed design development of the terminal's long-span roof. Her work in Taipei demonstrates a rare ability to translate complex computational design into precise, buildable solutions.

In Melbourne, Katherine led the detailed design of seven entrance buildings for the transformative Metro Tunnel Project, a major rail programme that has reshaped the city's connectivity since its opening in 2025. Before this, she directed the detailed design of a four-storey podium for Oriental One, a 107,000m² mixed-use development integrating homes, retail, amenity and public realm in Shanghai.

Alongside her infrastructure portfolio, Katherine leads RSHP's Modular Housing sector. She has overseen the delivery of multiple modular housing schemes and led the concept and scheme design for 45 market and affordable homes in Dartington. Designed using Modern Methods of Construction and classified as Category 1 Volumetric Modular, the project exemplifies her commitment to precision-led, high-performance design - advancing the practice's ambitions for carbon-neutral, scalable housing delivery.

Prior to RSHP, Katherine spent five years at Niall McLaughlin Architects where she led a major new-build and refurbishment project from concept to completion for Jesus College, University of Cambridge, and played key roles in both the Scheme Design and Tender Stage development of several student residential schemes for both Oxford and Cambridge universities. She returned to RSHP in 2017, bringing with her a strengthened focus on craft, context and institutional architecture.
