Summary of Experience

Mimi is a Senior Associate and an integral member of the RSHP team, having worked across the London, New York (2006–2008), and Sydney (2010–2015) offices since joining the practice in 2001.

As Project Architect and Team Lead for 2 Redman Place at The International Quarter (IQL) in Stratford, London, Mimi led the delivery of the 35,000m² Grade A office building, including the design and detailed coordination of the facade package. The project emphasised health and wellbeing in the workplace and is now occupied by Cancer Research UK and the British Council. The building achieved BREEAM Outstanding certification with a score of 94% and WELL Gold certification.

While part of the leadership team in the Sydney office, Mimi was responsible for delivering the Concept Plan Amendment for the Barangaroo South masterplan. Following approval and RSHP's appointment to design and deliver the three International Towers Sydney, Mimi led the facade design for the towers and podia, overseeing coordination with specialist subcontractors and supporting delivery.

During her time in the New York office, Mimi contributed to the construction documentation phase for Tower 3 at the World Trade Center, as well as the concept and scheme design phases for the refurbishment and expansion of the Jacob K. Javits Convention Center.

Mimi has also worked on a wide range of projects, including the Barangaroo and Sydney Metro competitions, and a masterplan for Victoria Harbour in Melbourne. Her experience spans residential developments in New York, Monte Carlo, and the UK, as well as educational and civic buildings such as Mossbourne Community Academy in London and the Senedd Cymru (Welsh Parliament) in Cardiff.

She was also responsible for delivering a series of new suites and external terraces at The Emory in London.

Recently, she has been working on a concept design for an embassy in Mexico City and mixed-use development in Australia.
