Summary of Experience

As a Senior Associate, Nicholas takes an active leadership role within the project design team, working on the design direction, management and coordination of all aspects of his projects, from engagement with the client team, project stakeholders and the wider consultant team to drive the project through all stages from concept to completion.

From the project's inception in 2007 until its completion in 2014, Nicholas was a core team member for the Stirling Prize shortlisted British Museum World Conservation and Exhibitions Centre project. His role involved the detailed development of the Conservation, Logistics and Storage aspects of the project, including extensive user-group consultation and coordination during the initial design stages.

Using this detail development and site experience, Nicholas then oversaw the Production aspect of the Stirling Prize shortlisted Macallan Distillery and Visitor Experience in Speyside, Scotland. As a purpose-built industrial facility, the architecture and whisky making equipment are inseparable, and required a great deal of detailed coordination with the Macallan, as well as their process engineers and fabricators.

Since then, Nicholas has been co leading the South Kensington Around Station Development project. This complex project, which involves building in close proximity to live Tube lines, has required extensive coordination with TfL's technical teams, in addition to the development partner of the Joint Venture client body. He has also been co-leading a Life Sciences Adaptive Reuse development and extension to an existing building in Central London. This has involved detailed collaboration with the engineering members of the design team, to establish the most efficient solution for the existing building.

In addition to his project work, Nicholas is a key member of the RSHP Recruitment Team, which is responsible for reviewing applications, interviewing and selecting new architectural members to join the practice. He is also a Part III mentor, helping to guide colleagues who are undertaking their professional qualification studies through the process.
